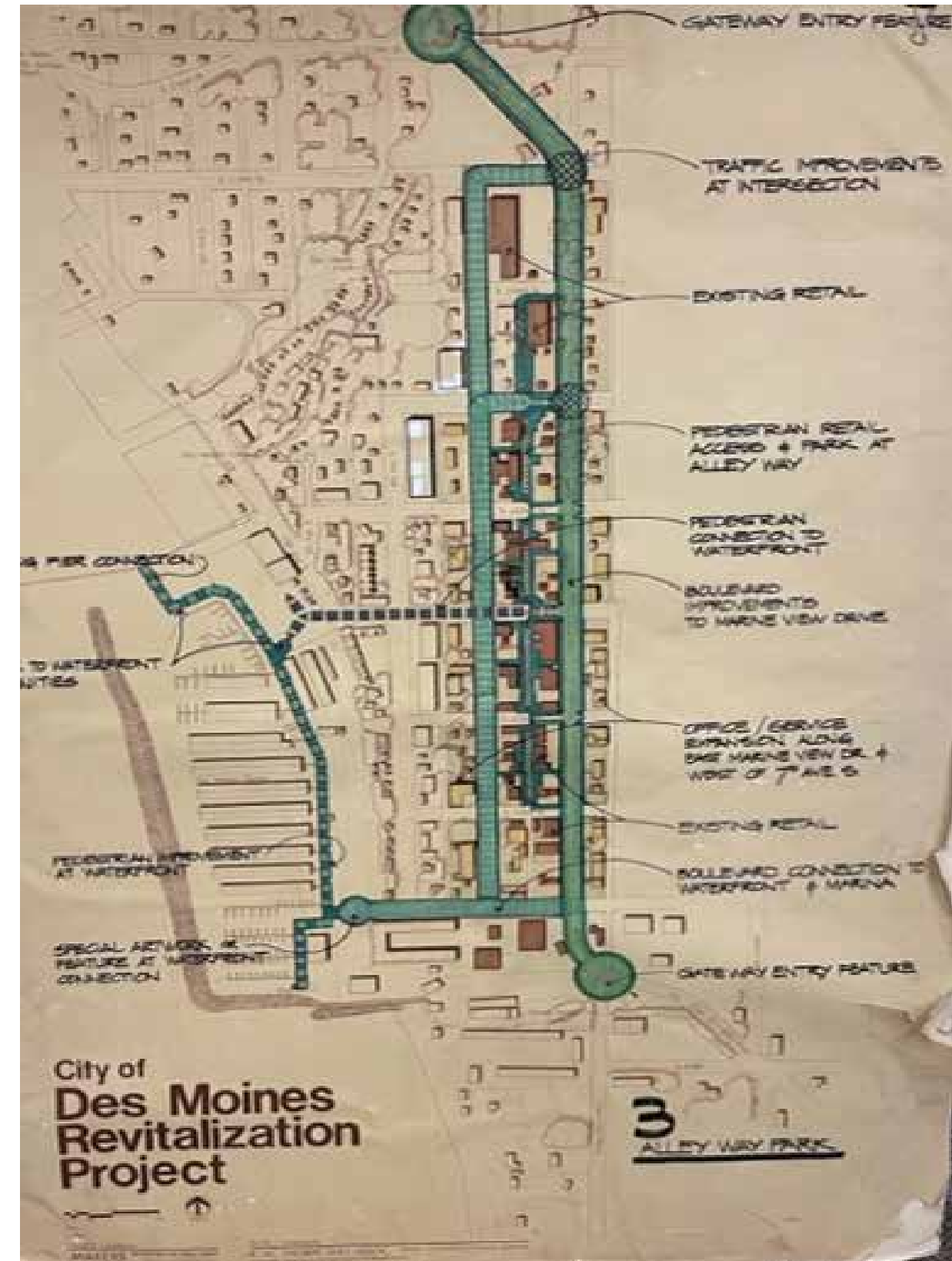
MARINA DISTRICT REDEVELOPMENT HISTORY

DES MOINES MARINA HISTORICAL REVIEW

- Through the life of the City and Marina, there have been many efforts to appropriately enhance the value of the waterfront to the City and region
- Tonight, we would like to recount an abbreviated history of those earlier efforts
- **COMMITMENT TO GROWTH, ACCESSIBILITY, AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT**

MID - 1980 PLANNING 1984

- The planning board highlights pedestrian access from the Downtown to the Marina
- This critical connection has evolved into the opportunity to create the Marina Steps



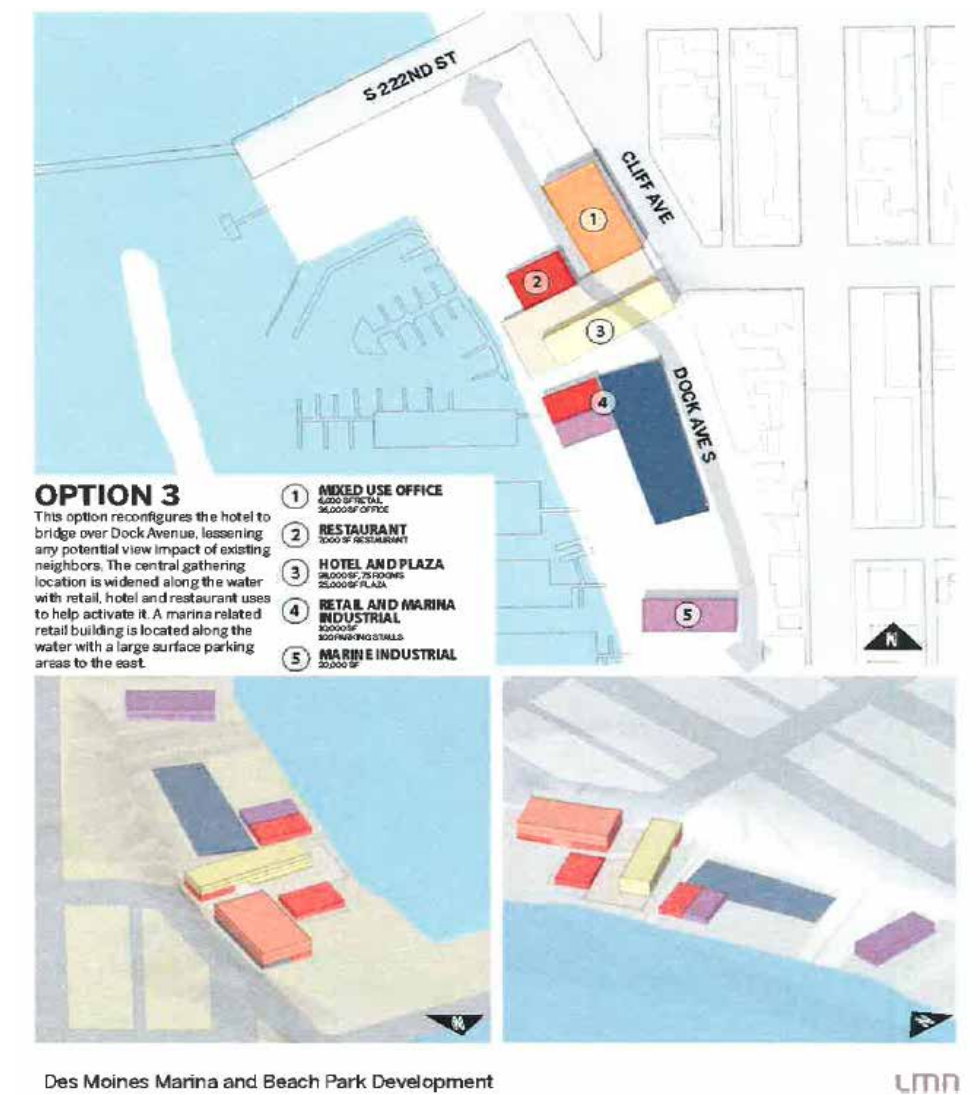
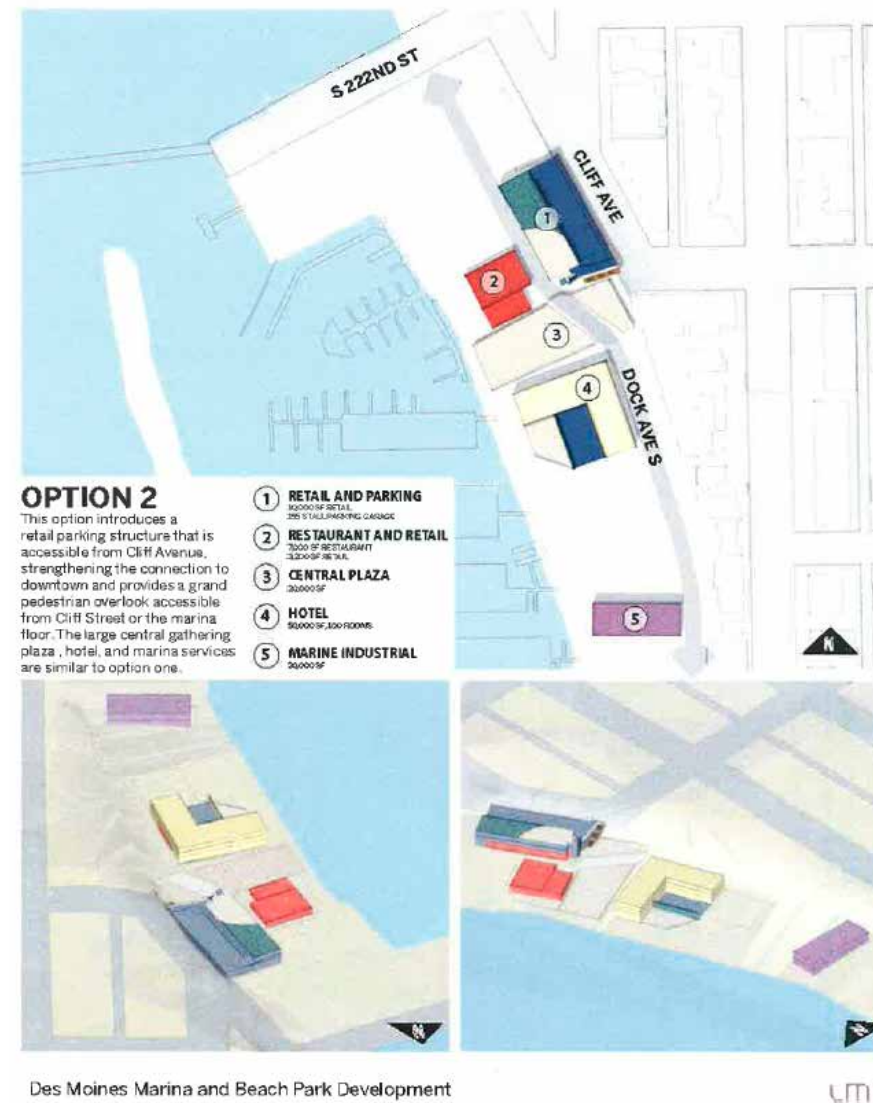
UNIVERSITY OF WASHINGTON MARINA DISTRICT ENHANCEMENT PLAN 2008

- In 2008 the University of Washington's Department of Architecture prepared a Marina District Enhancement Plan.



MARINA BEACH PARK DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE 2012

- Following the UW study, Council appointed a joint committee to review Marina and Beach Park Development.
- This joint committee, comprised of community members and Council members, recommended development options for the Marina.
- They considered 4 development options and ultimately their recommendations were a hybrid, combining options 2 and 3.



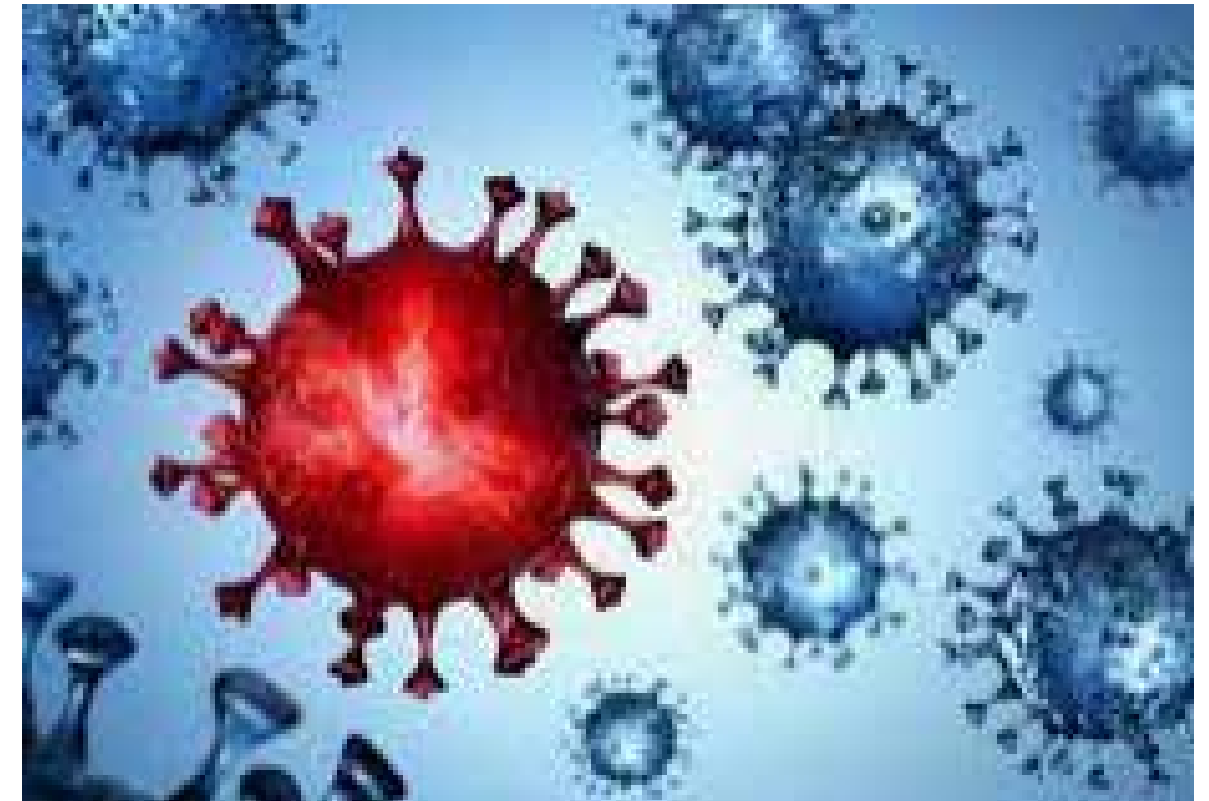
EFFORTS LEADING TO REQUEST FOR QUALIFICATIONS 2016-2020

- New Administration with expertise in economic development
- Since that time, three separate consultant studies reviewing market conditions, design options, and the potential for public/private partnerships
- Three large community open houses to review development options – providing public comment opportunities



COVID IMPACTS 2020

- Fall of 2019, Council authorized City Administration to identify Marina redevelopment partners
- COVID interrupted and delayed the process
- Significant delays across City programs, including Marina redevelopment efforts



EXCLUSIVE NEGOTIATING AGREEMENT 2022

- March 2022 - Entered into an Exclusive Negotiating Agreement (ENA) with Developer
- During negotiations, Developer expressed strong interest in expanding the development scope which exceeded requirements for development established by the city council
- September 2022 - City terminated ENA

CURRENT DYNAMIC

- **PUBLIC INVESTMENT:** As a result of COVID, and other national and international macro-economic factors, the City is in a better position to continue to pursue capital and infrastructure projects through public investment
- Public/private partnership may not achieve the desired timely outcomes

PUBLIC INVESTMENTS COMPLETED



- SOUND VIEW PARK: Transformation
- NORTH BULKHEAD: \$12M improvements to ensure structural integrity
- PASSENGER FERRY SERVICE: Phase I
- COMMUNITY SHUTTLE: Ongoing operation linking the Angle Lake Station to the Downtown and the Marina

CRITICAL LINKAGE OF DOWNTOWN TO THE MARINA

- **HEART OF MARINA REDEVELOPMENT:** The Marina Steps **LINK** the downtown to the Marina
- Critical additional phases include investment in Marina infrastructure, replacing docks, providing integrated access and utilization of the Marina, and the landside development
- Continuing to invest in the public infrastructure on the landside will accomplish pedestrian connectivity all the way from the entrance to the Beach Park, with promenade development that will eventually link to Anthony's Home Port Restaurant

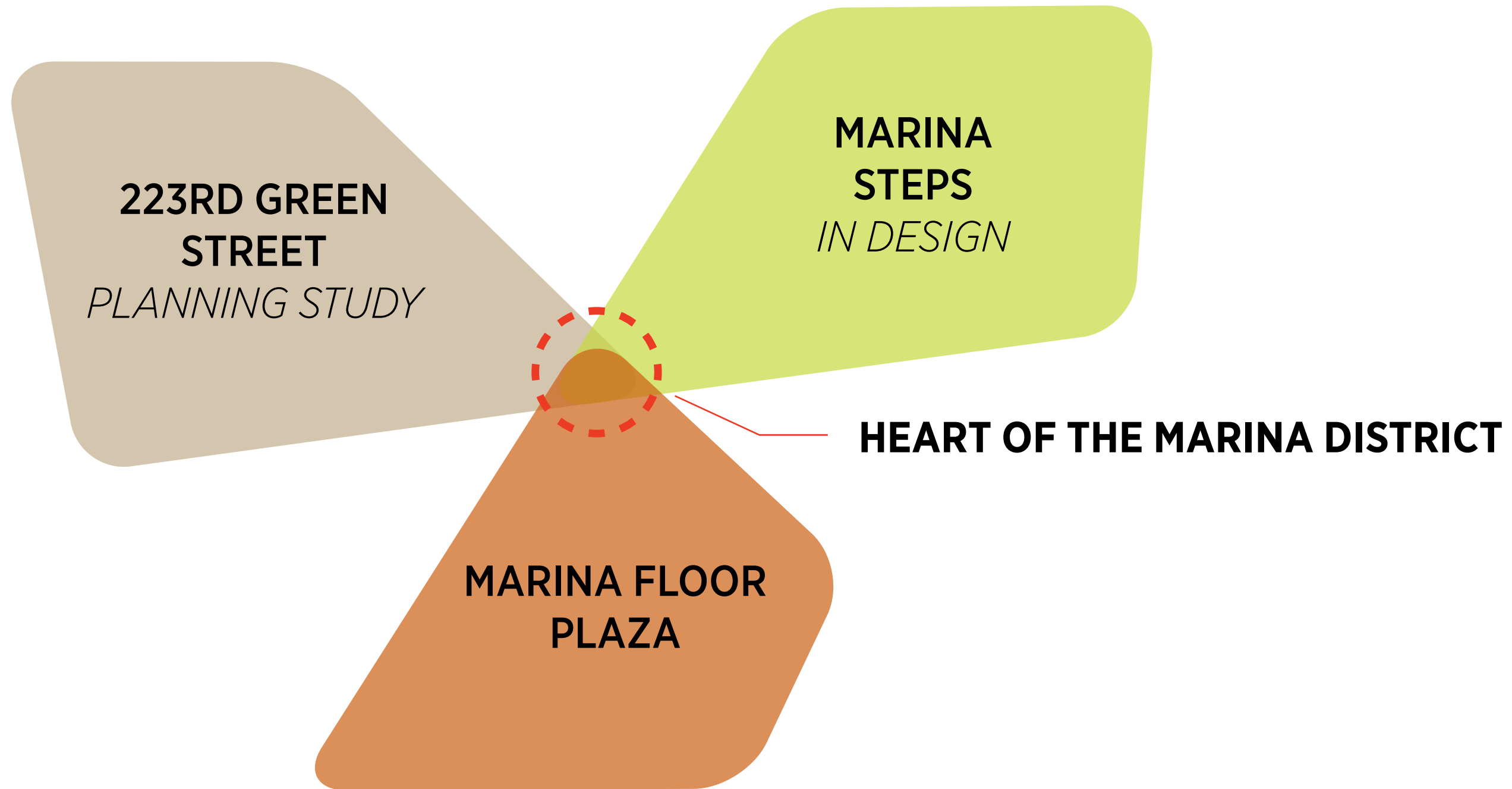

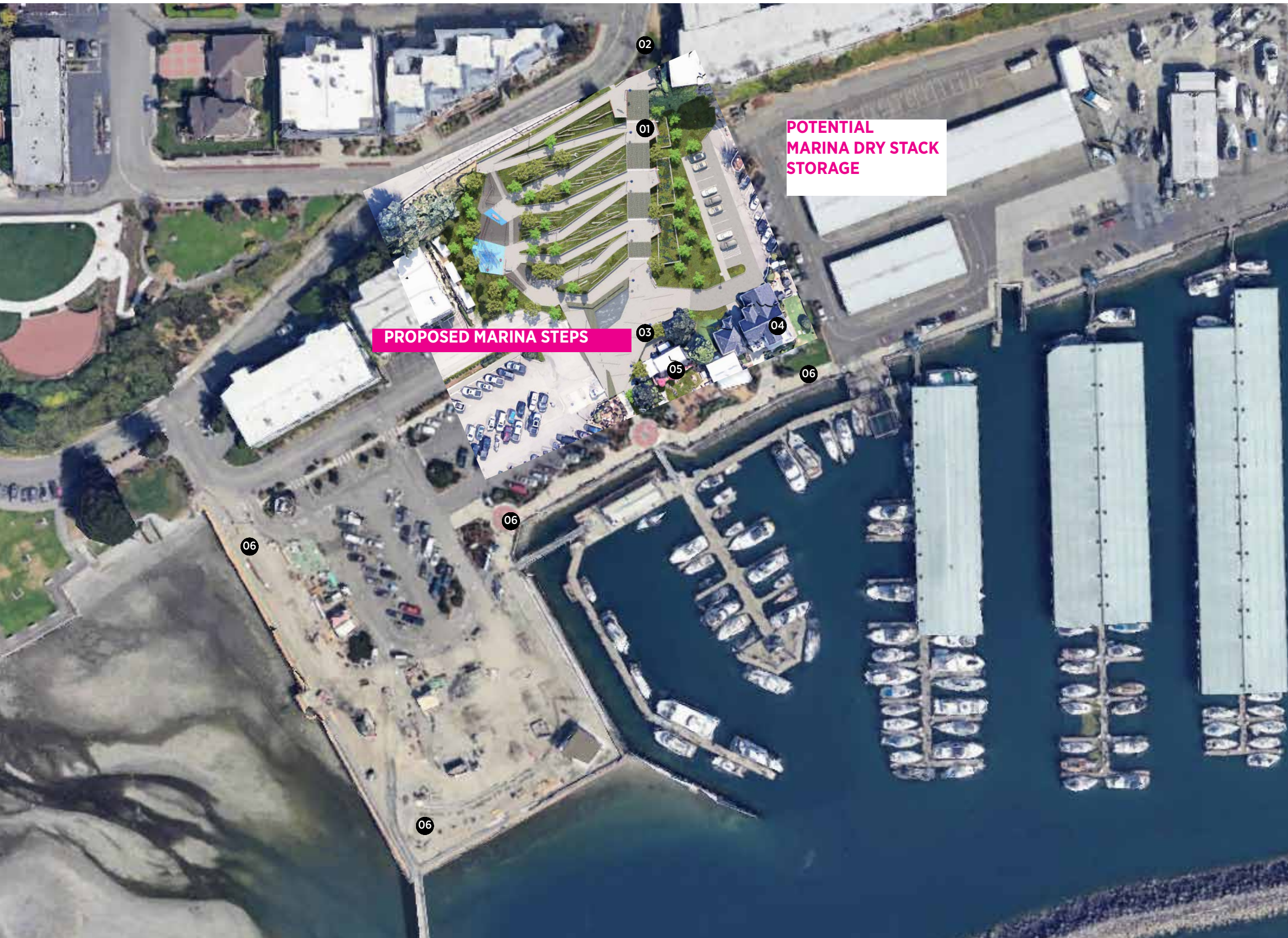

“**Inclusion and accessibility are key.** Include a communication board for thoes who are non verbal, make the play structure accessible to all.”

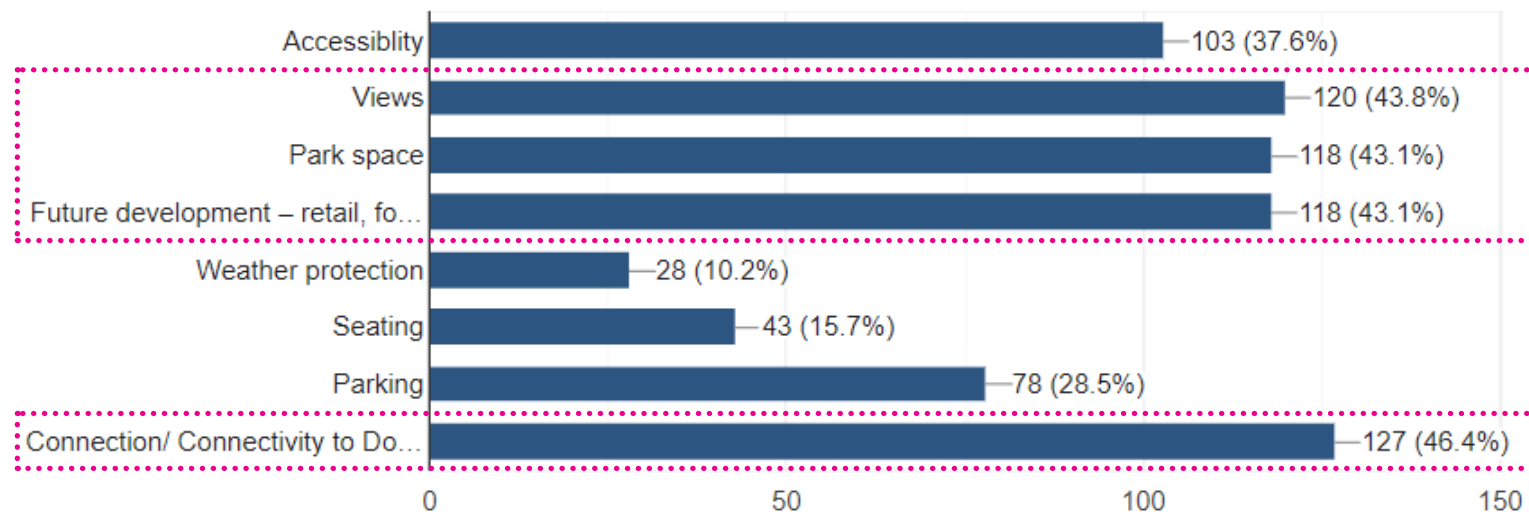
“Keep them simple and feeling local.”

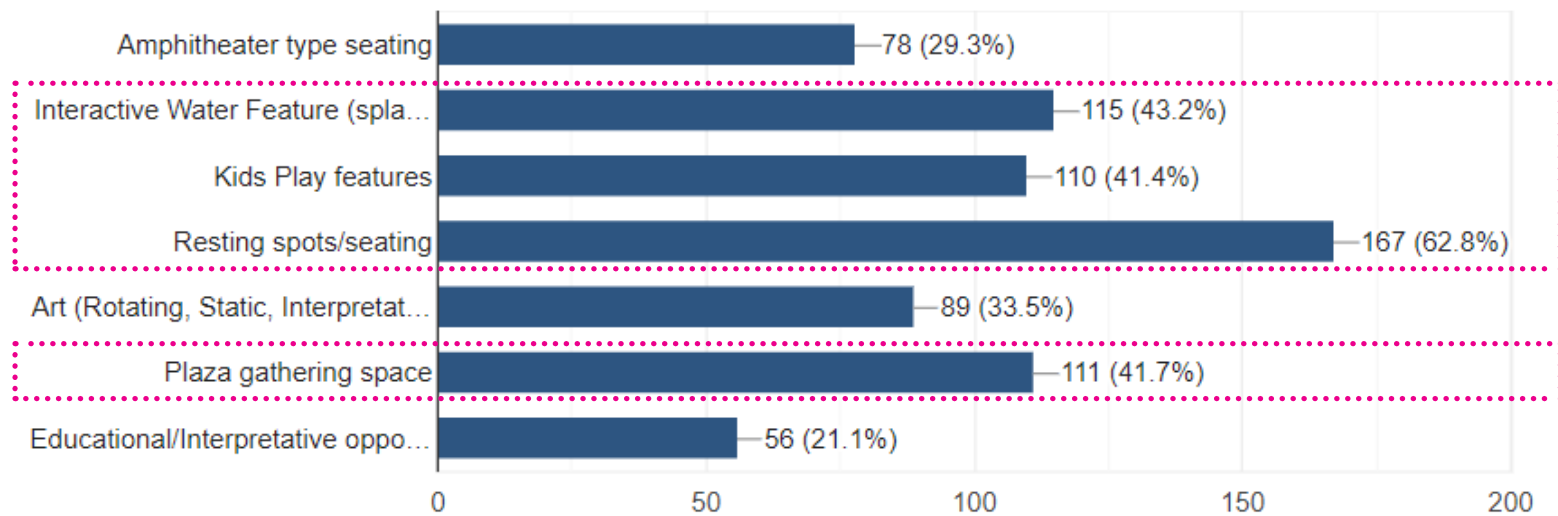

MARINA STEPS PUBLIC COMMENT | 274 RESPONSES OCTOBER

ADDITIONAL COMMENTS AND CONCERNS

- Some concern for parking, desire to reinstate paid parking.
- Support of Farmer's Market, access to it, and potential year- round use.
- Safety is imperative - sightlines and lighting.
- Consider neighbors and construction noise and increased use.
- Accessibility and Universal design is imperative.
- Native and adapted planting is desirable.
- Additional restaurants and retail would be a positive improvement.
- Connect bike facilities, consider marina.

CURRENT DESIGN DEVELOPMENT

DESIGN RESPONSE BASED ON PUBLIC COMMENT

CONTINUE to articulate the stairs and ramps for universal, comfortable access.

CONTINUE to study view sheds from outside and within the project.

ADD seating nooks along pathways and plaza.

REFINE + DEVELOP the play areas up the hillside.

DESIGN a splash pad water feature and accompanying seating in the plaza.

INCLUDE cues from the Marina and Waterfront design language.

UNDERSTAND lighting design for safety, CPTED lens, as well as visual continuity with marina.

ACCOMODATE and support the farmer's market at the marina floor.
