# City Manager Weekly Report January 5, 2024

#### **New Mayor and Deputy Mayor Selected**

At the January 4 City Council meeting, the Council voted to select Traci Buxton as the next Mayor for the City. Her term began immediately and will continue through the end of 2025. The Council also voted to select Harry Steinmetz as the Deputy Mayor. His term will run concurrently with the Mayors. Congratulations to you both! Also a note of sincere appreciation and thanks to our outgoing Mayor Matt Mahoney for his years of dedicated service to leading our community. Matt will continue to serve on the City Council as a Councilmember.

#### **Duwamish Head Sailboat Race**

This Saturday January 6, the Three Tree Point Yacht Club is hosting their annual race that has its start and finish line in front of the Des Moines Marina fishing pier. The first group will begin at 9:25am with others to follow. Their course is in the northerly to the Duwamish Head Light, on to the Blakely Rock Light, and then south to the finish line at the fishing pier. # Redondo Park Zone Camera Update

We continue to progress towards activating Speed Enforcement Cameras in the Redondo Park Zone. There will be two locations monitoring traffic in both directions for a total of four cameras. The warning signs have been installed at the locations (Redondo Beach Dr. and Redondo Way S.) however final implementation has been delayed past our January 1 goal date. Because these will be the first Park Zone Speed Enforcement Cameras in the state, there have been a number of novel issues that have arisen. We are waiting on our vendor to finalize the backend software required to run this program and we are working with the Administrative Office of the Courts to get approval of the infraction notices that will be issued. Once those items are completed, the cameras will be mounted and the 30 day warning period will begin.

### **Indoor Pickle Ball Coming to Des Moines**

Starting January 8, every Monday from 12-2pm and Wednesday from 10-12, the City will be offering Indoor Pickle Ball at the Field House. If you weren't aware, Pickle Ball is officially the <u>state sport of Washington</u>. The City may create leagues in the future if there is enough participation, but for now, just show up and play!
